PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence punishable under sections 294(b), 323, 507, 324, 342, 379 and 506(ii) IPC read with Section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Women Harassment Act in Crime No.334 of 2014 on the file of the respondent police and seek anticipatory bail.

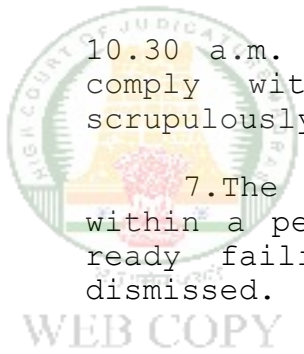
2.The case of the prosecution is that due to civil dispute there was a wordy quarrel between the petitioners and the defacto complainant and the petitioners attacked the de facto complainant with wooden log and caused injuries and abused with filthy language and stolen some articles from the de facto complainant.

3.Learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are the innocent persons and they have been falsely implicated in this case.

4.Learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) submitted that the injured has been discharged from the hospital.

5.Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and the learned Government Advocate(Crl. Side) appearing for the state and also perused the entire materials available on record.

6.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Vallioor and on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand and service) each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police, daily twice at



10.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. until further orders. The petitioners shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

7. The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready failing which, the petitioner for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
