Kuldip Singh, J. (Oral)

A complaint under Sections 31 and 32 of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 has been filed against the present petitioner. The petitioner wants to visit Norway in connection with the project of his company. He sought permission from the trial Court to go abroad from 1.1.2015 to 31.1.2015. The trial Court vide the impugned order dated 20.12.2014 allowed the prayer with a condition that he will furnish a bank guarantee of Rs.five lacs along with an affidavit that he will not mis-use the permission and in case of violation of the conditions, Rs.five lac shall stand forfeit to the State. Some other conditions were also imposed.

The objection of learned counsel for the petitioner is only regarding the bank guarantee of Rs. Five lac, whereas the other conditions are acceptable to him. Learned counsel for the petitioner

states that the bank is insisting on deposit of Rs.five lac to furnish bank guarantee and that the petitioner is not in a position to deposit such a huge amount. Learned counsel for the petitioner undertakes that he is ready to furnish other kind of security.

Keeping in view the nature of the case and the facts and circumstances and the difficulty expressed by learned counsel for the petitioner, the petition is allowed to the extent that in place of bank guarantee of Rs.five lac, the petitioner shall furnish the security of immovable property to the extent of Rs.ten lac of himself or any other person and the documents of the property shall be attached with the surety bonds. The remaining conditions shall remain intact.
