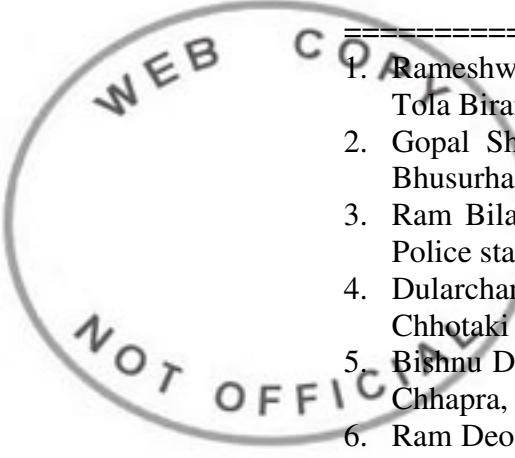

The scheme of regularization is not available to seasonal workers by very nature of their engagement.

The submission of the counsel for the petitioners that they are required to be treated at par with other daily wagers is based on misplaced kind of pleadings and assertions.

In addition to that, respondents have categorically denied

any kind of right of these petitioners for regularization in absence of any policy especially keeping in mind the nature of such engagement. It is also categorically stated that most of these petitioners were disengaged more than 15-16 years ago.

If that be so, no direction for regularization is required to be issued.

Writ applications have no merit. They are dismissed.
