2 19-08-2015 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
A.P.P. for the State.

The petitioner seeks bail in a case registered for the
offence punishable under Sections 147, 148, 149, 341, 323, 504,
307, 302 of IPC.

Allegation is that the petitioner and 10 other accused
armed with various weapons came in the lane and Shyam Sundar
Choudhary caught hold of the father (deceased) of the informant
and Sanjay Choudhary assaulted him with '*Khanti*' on his head.
He fell down and thereafter, other accused also assaulted him.

It is submitted that specific allegation of overtact is
against Shyam Sundar Choudhary and Sanjay Choudhary. There is
no specific allegation against the petitioner. The petitioner has no
criminal antecedent. However, after investigation charge-sheet has
already been submitted and there is no chance of tampering with

the witnesses.

It is further submitted that in similar facts and circumstances, co-accused Pramod Chaudhary @ Guddu Choudhary has been granted bail by this Court vide Cr. Misc. No. 26091 of 2015.

Considering the facts and circumstances, the above named petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (ten thousand only) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Nawada in Akbarpur P. S. Case No. 51 of 2015 with following conditions:-

1. The petitioner will not indulge himself in similar or any other offence.
2. One of the bailors must be the close relative of the petitioner.
3. The petitioner will be well represented in the Court on each and every date and in case of absence for two consecutive dates or in case of violation of terms of bail, his bail bond would be liable to be cancelled by the learned Court concerned.
