When the case was called out for hearing, no
one appeared on behalf of the petitioner. Learned counsels
for the Private respondents and the State are present.

The writ petitioner was the applicant before
Deputy Collector Land Reforms (hereinafter referred to as
“D.C.L.R.”) claiming to be a Bataidar of the private
respondents by virtue of the fact that private respondents
had purchased the lands from original landlord. All the
authorities below have specifically ruled on facts as



against the writ petitioner and that being so, in exercise of the power under judicial review, there being no procedural impropriety, this Court not sitting in Appeal, cannot interfere with those findings.

That being so, there appears no merit in this writ petition. It is, accordingly, dismissed.
