2 20-03-2015 Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned counsel for the Bank, I am not satisfied that this is a case for any interference. The petitioner was alleged to have temporarily embezzled certain money. Upon that charge a

departmental proceeding being initiated, he was compulsorily retired. His appeal has been dismissed. In judicial review the Court does not sit as a appellate court; it only looks into the decision making process. There is no aberration.

The writ application merits no consideration and dismissed as such.
