When the matter was taken up for hearing, it was found from the Office Notes that the writ application stood dismissed as against respondent no. 6 and 7 for non-compliance of order dated 06.05.1997, and the learned counsel for the petitioner had, accordingly, been informed, but no steps for restoration had been taken. There are four independent respondents nos. 5, 6, 7 and 8 namely, Rewati Raman Prasad Sinha, Rajiv Ranjan Prasad, Manindra Nath Verma and Akhilesh Kumar Verma, who are contesting

respondents and in whose favour the impugned orders have been passed.

In absence of the said respondents, the petitioner cannot be granted any relief, as such, the writ petition itself become incompetent. It is accordingly, dismissed.
