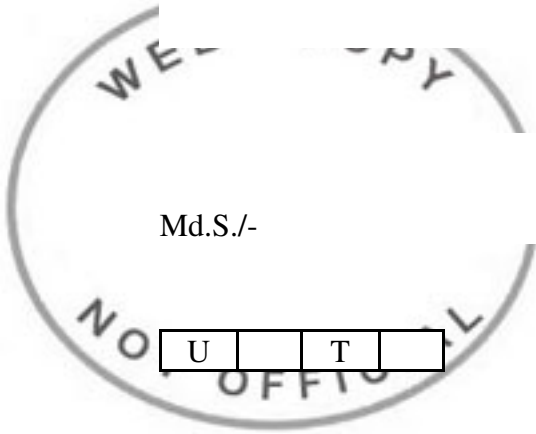
ORAL ORDER

3 13-01-2015 By filing the present application under Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India, the prayer made by the petitioner in paragraph 1 is as under:-

“1. that, the instant application under article 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India has been filed praying for issuance of writ in the nature of prohibition, prohibiting the accused persons namely 1. Keyur Majumdar S/o Shri Dinesh Majumdar and 2. Supriti Bandhopadhyay Daughter of Late Abani Mohan Bandopadhyay to not to abuse the process of the Learned Court to secure favorable orders.”
