2 21-07-2015 The petitioners are apprehending their arrest in connection with Bakhtiarpur P.S. Case No. 236 of 2014 for the offence instituted under Section 302/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned counsel for the State.

The prosecution story, in brief, is that the daughter of the informant, namely, Lalita Devi was killed by the accused persons.

It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioners that petitioners are *mother-in-law* and *brother-in-law* of the deceased. It is further submitted that the petitioners are separate in mess and property with the husband of the deceased and have no concerned with the affair of the husband of the deceased. It is submitted that

petitioners have got no criminal antecedent.

On behalf of the State, it has been submitted that the petitioners are named in the F.I.R.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances, let the petitioners above named, be released on bail in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a period of six weeks from today in connection with Bakhtiarpur P.S. Case No. 236 of 2014 on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/-(Ten Thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Saharsa, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
