4 15-05-2015 After some arguments, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner seeks permission to withdraw the present writ petition with a liberty to approach the Railway Claims Tribunal, Patna Bench for grant of appropriate relief in the factual matrixes of the case.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondents does not raise any objection to the aforesaid prayer made on behalf of the petitioner.

In above view of the matter, permission sought for is accorded.
