ORAL ORDER

3. 25-03-2015 After some argument, learned counsel for the petitioner, in presence of learned A.C. to Addl. Advocate General – 2, submits that ofcourse, earlier a complaint was filed before the District Magistrate, Saharsa, vide **Annexure ‘10’** to the writ petition in respect of irregularities committed in the selection of Anganbari Sevika in the Gram Panchayat, Sahpur for the Anganbari Centre - Bhelahi, but it appears that in accordance with provision contained in Clause 8 of the Guidelines for

Sevika/Assistant Sevika of 2008, an affidavit was not filed. A prayer is being made for disposal of the present writ petition granting liberty to the petitioner to file a fresh complaint before the District Magistrate, Saharsa with proper affidavit.

The writ petition stands disposed of with an indication that if such complaint is filed within a period of eight weeks from today before the respondent no. 4/District Magistrate, Saharsa, the District Magistrate, Saharsa may examine the complaint and pass appropriate order in accordance with law, preferably; within a period of three months from the date of filing of such complaint with affidavit.
