Merely because the notice contained in Annexure-8 may not be happily worded, the apprehension which the petitioner expresses is totally misplaced for the reason that the Bihar C. C. A. Rules lay down the procedure for conduct of a departmental proceeding step by step. No enquiry officer or disciplinary authority can ignore what has been laid down therein nor can he go wrong after perusing those provisions as to what is required to be done and in what manner.

2. In view of the same, the apprehension of the petitioner on

the basis of the notice dated 26/2/2015 is an effort to pre-empt the proceeding.

3. Writ application is, therefore, dismissed.
