2 16-01-2015 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and Sri Nishi Nath Ojha, learned counsel, who has appeared on behalf of Central Bank of India.

The present petition has been filed for initiating contempt proceeding against Opp.Parties on an allegation of wilful disobedience to an interim order dated 20.08.2013 passed in C.W.J.C.No.8273 of 2013. The order dated 20.08.2013 is quoted herein below:
