Learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner tries to prevail upon this Court by submission that the reason for issuance of Annexure- 7 is otherwise and relates to certain allegations made by the petitioner against certain contractors. Instead of taking action against them, petitioner has been transferred.

What had transpired may be another issue altogether.

If there is no reflection of the same in the order of transfer contained in Annexure- 7 and since petitioner was on deputation as such to the post he was holding prior to his transfer to

the basic post without any kind of insinuation, the order of transfer contained in Annexure- 7 is not required to be interfered with on ifs and buts.

Writ is dismissed.
