Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and
the respondents.

Following is the relief sought for in the
present writ application.

“This is an application for issuance
of appropriate writ order or
direction for calling and quashing
of appointment order dated
24.04.2000 of respondent no. 6 on

the post of Director, Nav Nalanda Mahavihar and further for a direction to the Mahavihar to appoint respondent no. 7 to function as care taker Director of Mahavihar till it is taken over by the Central Government with its assets and liability”.

I am of the view that no relief as sought for in this writ application, can be granted in a proceeding under Article 226 of the Constitution of India. I find that the writ application filed on behalf of the petitioner is not maintainable, in view of the pleadings in the writ application and even otherwise it appears that with the efflux of time, the present writ application has lost any purpose, whatsoever.

The writ application is accordingly, dismissed.
