6 13-08-2015 These are private disputes between the parties.

The case is not required to be adjudicated under Article 226 of the Constitution of India. Petitioner should raise such issues before a Civil Court, which is the competent Court or even a Magistrate Court for such disputes where evidence both oral and documentary can be lead.

Writ petition is accordingly, dismissed, keeping in view the recent decision of the Division Bench with regard to such dispute being not maintainable under Article 226 of the Constitution of India.
