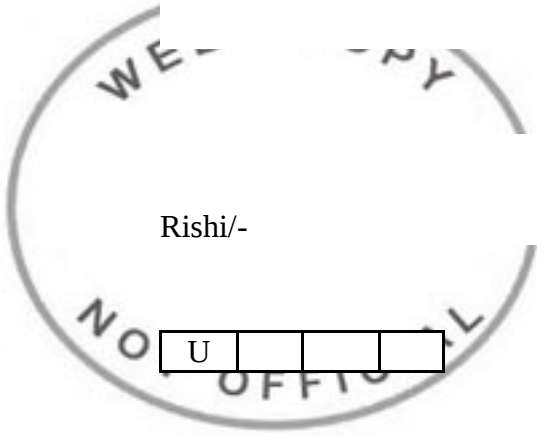

**ORAL ORDER**
