ORAL ORDER

4. 25-08-2015 After some argument, Sri Tej Bahadur Singh, learned senior counsel, who was assisted by Sri Mritunjay Kumar, learned counsel for the petitioner, in presence of learned A.C. to Govt. Pleader – 13, makes a prayer for disposal of the writ petition so that the petitioner may avail statutory remedy.

It goes without saying that if the petitioner approaches the authority concerned under the provisions of Bihar Buildings (Lease, Rent and Eviction) Control Act, 1982 within a period of

six weeks from today with limitation petition, the authority concerned may examine the same in its right perspective and pass order in accordance with law.

Learned counsel for the petitioner is also granted liberty to raise all the points, which have been raised in the present writ petition, before the authority concerned.
