The petitioner has filed the present writ petition seeking a direction for execution/ implementation of the judgment and order dated 25th March, 2006 (Annexure-3) passed in B.S.,E. Case No. 10 of 2003/12 of 1982 by the learned Presiding Officer, Labour Court, Patna.

I am afraid, the High Court cannot be permitted to be approached for getting an order/ judgment passed by the learned Labour Court executed.
