ORAL ORDER

6 29-10-2015 Heard Sri Ram Kishore Singh, learned counsel, who

was assisted by Sri Sushil Kumar, learned counsel for the

petitioner and learned AC to GP No. 1.

The petitioner has invoked the writ jurisdiction of this
court with a prayer to direct the authorities to pay salary of the
petitioner on the post of Shiksha Mitra from January 2007.

In this case a counter affidavit has been filed on behalf
of the respondent and a preliminary objection has been raised that
since for such dispute there is already efficacious remedy
available to the petitioner for approaching District Teacher
Appellate Authority, the petitioner may be advised to avail
alternative remedy.

After noticing the stand taken in paragraph no. 6 of the counter affidavit, learned counsel for the petitioner makes a prayer for disposal of the present writ petition, so that, the petitioner may approach the District Teacher Appellate Authority under Rule 18 of the Bihar Prarambhik Shikshak Niyojan (Seva & Shart) Rules 2008.

In view of prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner, the writ petition stands disposed of granting liberty to the petitioner to avail the remedy as indicated above.

It goes without saying that if the petitioner approaches the District Teacher Appellate Authority within eight weeks from today, same may be entertained and decided on its own merit without unnecessary delay.

The writ petition stands disposed of.
