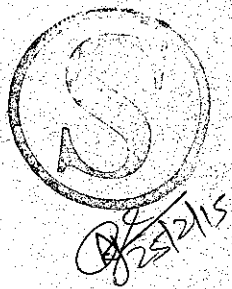

**ORAL ORDER
(23/02/2015)**

Learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that petitioners application under Section 57 (2) of Chhattisgarh Land Revenue Code, 1959 is pending consideration before the Sub Divisional Officer (Revenue) Arang-Abhanpur, District Raipur since last more than four years. Therefore, the writ petition may be disposed of with a direction to the concerned revenue authority to decide the application at the earliest.

2. Considering the limited prayer made at this stage of the proceedings, the writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the Sub Divisional Officer (Revenue) Arang-Abhanpur, District Raipur to decide petitioners' application under Section 57(2) of Chhattisgarh Land Revenue Code, 1959 as early as possible and preferably within a period of six months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

3. It is made clear that this Court has not expressed any opinion on the merits of the case and the respondent-authorities shall decide the representation, on its own merits, strictly in accordance with law, without treating any observation made in this order, as opinion on the merits of the case.
