ORDER

(23-1-2015)

1. Heard on admission.
2. By this appeal under Section 19(1) of the Family Courts Act, 1984, the appellant has challenged the legality and propriety of the order dated 10.12.2013 passed by the Judge, Family Court, Ambikapur, in Civil Suit No.32-A/2013, whereby the Family Court has dismissed the suit filed under Section 24 and 26 of the Hindu Marriage Act for maintenance *pendente lite* on the ground that the appellant is enjoying the property of the respondent and is getting income from agricultural operations.
3. We have perused the order impugned.
4. In the light of detailed order showing the expected income, we do not find any case for worth of admission.
5. Consequently, the appeal is dismissed. However, the Family Court is directed to expedite the trial and decide the case as early as possible. No order as to costs.
