ORDER
(22.01.2015)

According to the petitioner he had done his D.Ed. On 10.10.2000 on his own expenses after taking prior permission from the department and therefore he is entitled for two advance increments. Further case of the petitioner is that having granted the benefit of two increments the same could have not been cancelled by order dated 16.01.2014.

2. Counsel for the petitioner submits that his case is squarely covered by the decision of this Court rendered in W.P.(S) No. 6927/2011 and batch of other petitions on 6.12.2013 which has subsequently been confirmed by the Division Bench as well.
3. The State counsel does not dispute the factual and legal position pointed out by the counsel for the petitioner.
4. In view of the submission made by counsel for the

petitioner, the present petition is allowed in terms of order dated 6.12.2013 passed by this Court in W.P.(S) No. 6927/2011 and batch of other petitions. Accordingly, the order dated 16.01.2014 (Annexure P-1) is set aside as far as it relates to the petitioner.
