The State of Maharashtra along with companion matters passed by this Court which was based upon the earlier Division Bench Order dated 12 September 2012 in Writ Petition No. 5258/2012-Ms. Sandhya Laxman Ghosalkar vs. The State of Maharashtra and ors., along with other connected matters, the present Writ Petitions can

be disposed of by directing Respondent No.3-Education Officer to consider the representation/application filed for approval by the Petitioner with effect from 11 June 2012 i.e. the date of appointment and to grant all the related benefits. Order accordingly.

4 The learned AGP appearing for the Respondents conceded to the position of law and so also on facts, as there is no issue with regard to the averments so made for their entitlement based upon the law so laid down from time to time.

5 All the writ petitions are disposed of in the above terms.
