JUDGMENT

Shaffique, J.

The petitioner has approached this Court seeking police protection in the matter relating to the conduct of a Hotel namely 'K.R.Inn', at Perumbilavu, Thrissur. According to the petitioner, the 5th respondent has trespassed into the Hotel premises and has created law and order situation. Though a petition was submitted to the Police, no action was taken in the matter.

2. Learned Government Pleader submits that on the basis of the complaint received from the petitioner, Police has made necessary enquiry and law and order situation has been maintained. Thereafter no untoward incident is reported.

In the facts and circumstances of the case we do not think that further orders are necessary in the matter. We only observe that if there is any further complaint, the

petitioner is at liberty to approach the Police, who shall look into the matter and dispose of the same in accordance with law.

The Writ Petition is disposed of as above.
