JUDGMENT

It is reported that the petitioners have already filed ARC No.61/2015 before the Arbitration Court, Trivandrum. Since parallel proceedings cannot be maintained, the learned counsel for the petitioners has intended to withdraw the writ petition with a leave of this Court, so that the petitioners could approach this Court once again based on the outcome of the arbitration proceedings.

2. It is made clear that if at all the petitioners intend to pursue further based on the outcome of the arbitration case, it is entirely open for them to take recourse to statutory measures under Section 69 or any other relevant provision of the Act. It needs no express leave from this Court.

Accordingly, this Court dismisses the writ petition as having been withdrawn.
