The petitioner confines her relief to easy instalments to pay the amount due. The petitioner points out that a sum of ₹40,000/- (Rupees Forty thousand only) has been duly paid pursuant to the interim orders in this writ petition.

2. I permit the petitioner to pay the balance amount due in ten equal monthly instalments starting from 10.03.2015. The coercive steps as against the petitioner shall be put on hold if the instalments are duly paid. The coercive steps at the instance of the first respondent bank can surge ahead if the petitioner commits any one default.
