Writ petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India filed praying for issuance of a Writ of Habeas Corpus to call for the records pertaining to detention order passed by second respondent against the detenu Victor @ Royappan S/o.Arulappan, aged about 39 years, in C.M.P.No.28/Goonda/2015/M1 dated 10.04.2015, quash the same and consequently, to direct the respondents to produce the detenu, who is at present confined at Central Prison, Salem, before this Court and set him at liberty.

O R D E R

(The order of the Court was made by C.T.SELVAM, J.)

Petitioner is the mother of the detenu Victor @ Royappan S/o.Arulappan, who has been branded as "Goonda" under the Tamil Nadu Act 14 of 1982 and detained under orders of second respondent passed in C.M.P.No.28/Goonda/2015/M1 dated 10.04.2015. Such order is under challenge herein.

2. The detenu came to adverse notice in the following cases:

2	Mohanur Police Station Crime No.56 of 2015	294(b) and 506(ii) IPC

The ground case has been registered against the detenu in Crime No.60 of 2015 on the file of Mohanur Police Station for offences u/s.392 r/w 397 IPC.

3. Amidst several grounds raised, learned counsel for petitioner submits that towards informing the possibility of the detenu being released on bail, order of bail passed by learned Principal District Sessions Judge, Namakkal, in CMP No.777 of 2014 in connection with the case in Crime No.16 of 2014 on the file of Vazhavandhinadu Police Station, has been referred to by the detaining authority. The order copy therein has been furnished to the detenu, but the bail application in such case has not been furnished and that the same adversely has affected the detenu's right of making an effective representation.

4. We have heard learned Additional Public Prosecutor on the above submissions.

5. Non furnishing of relevant documents would deprive the detenu the opportunity of making effective representation to the authorities concerned. The same amounts to infringement of right enshrined under Article 22(5) of the Constitution of India and would vitiate the order of detention. For the aforesaid reason, this Court would allow the present petition.

6. This Habeas Corpus Petition is allowed. The detention order passed by second respondent against the detenu Victor @ Royappan S/o.Arulappan, made in C.M.P.No.28/Goonda/2015/M1

dated 10.04.2015, is quashed. The detenu is ordered to be set at liberty forthwith, unless his custody is required in connection with any other case.

The present order is only for the purpose of disposal of this petition and shall not have any bearing upon connected criminal cases pending before the competent Court.
