4. It is well settled in the matrimonial disputes that the convenience of wife is given preference in the matter of place of hearing. Furthermore, Section 19(iii)(a) of the Hindu Marriages Act states that the matrimonial disputes could be heard at the place of residence of the wife. 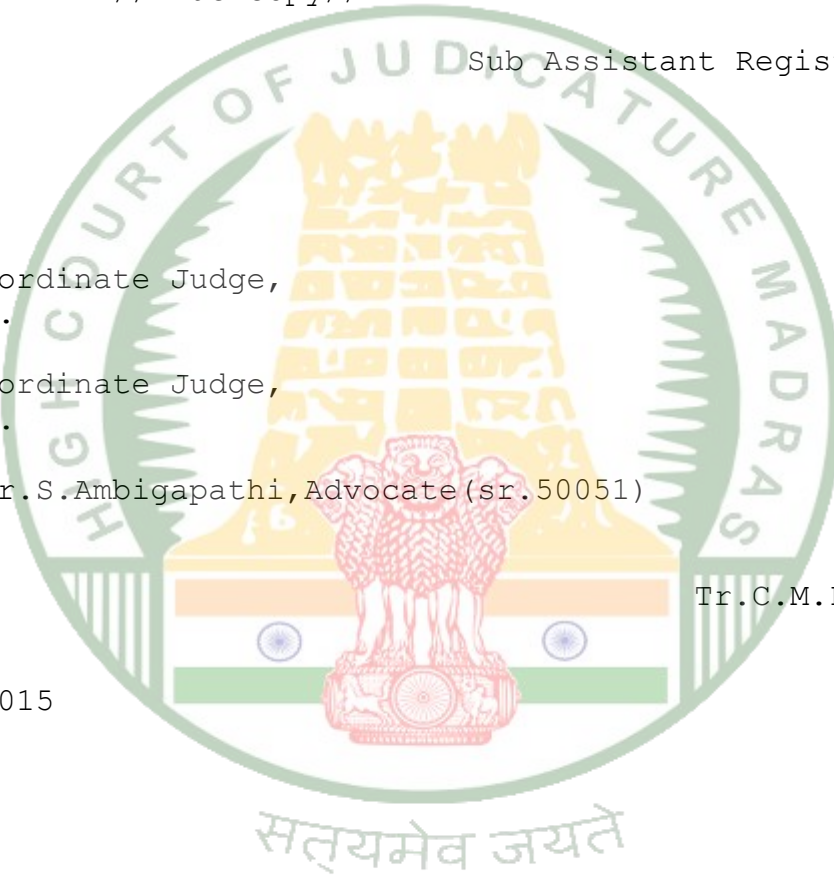
