5. Heard the learned Additional Government Pleader appearing for the respondents 1 to 3. Though the fourth respondent has been served and her name is printed in the cause list, none appears for the fourth respondent.

In the light of the above, without going into the merits of the petitioner's contention, there will be a direction to the first respondent to consider the petitioner's representation dated 05.05.2014, and pass appropriate orders on merits and in accordance with law, within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

With the above direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of. No costs.

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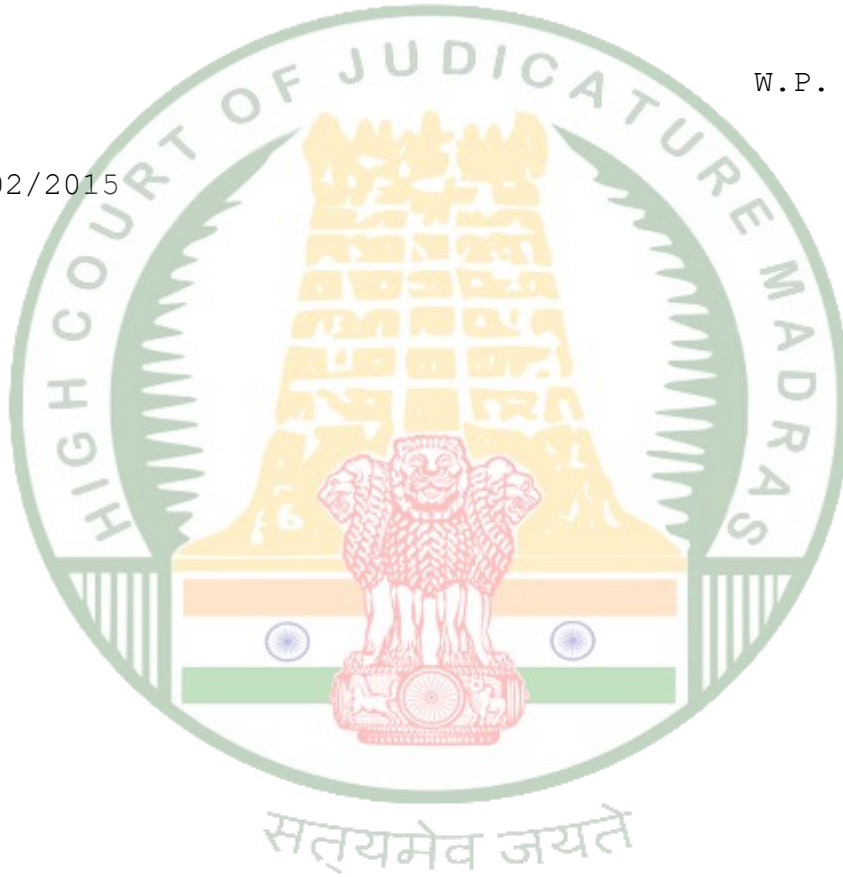
