ORDER

Seeking to issue a mandamus to the respondent directing him to consider her application dated 24.08.2015 for the grant of All India Contract Carriage Permit, the petitioner is now before this court with this writ petition.

She applied for the grant of All India Contract Carriage Permit to the respondent on 24.08.2015 along with requisite fees and necessary documents and the same is pending with the respondent for consideration. accordance with law and pass appropriate orders thereon within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order. No costs.
