PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The Petitioner, who is arrayed as A2 apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 452, 294(b), 323, 324, 355, 506(ii) and 307 of IPC, in Crime No.211 of 2015 on the file of the respondent police and hence, seeks anticipatory bail.

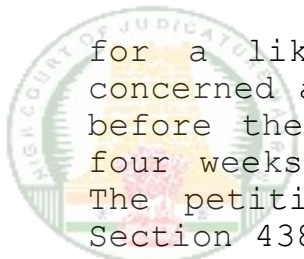
2.The case of the prosecution is that due to land dispute, there was an altercation between the accused and the de-facto complainant, in which the accused attacked him with deadly weapons, caused injuries and also threatened the de-facto complainant with dire consequences.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that A1, A3 and A4 were enlarged on bail by the Sessions Court, Madurai in Crl.M.P.No.4157 of 2015, dated 17.06.2015.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent submitted that the injured has been discharged from the hospital.

5.Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the fact that the injured has been discharged from the hospital and A1, A3 and A4 were enlarged by the Sessions Court, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6.Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.IV, Madurai and on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each



for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.00 a.m. for a period of four weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation. The petitioner shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. Scrupulously.

7. The petitioner shall appear before the Judicial Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
