PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

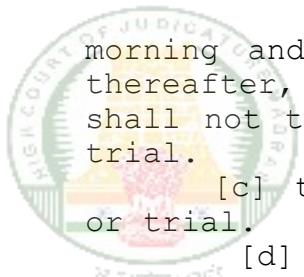
The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 11 and 12 of Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960 and Sections 7 and 9 of Tamil Nadu Jallikattu Regulation Act and Sections 143 and 188 of Indian Penal Code in Crime No.10 of 2015 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. It is the case of the prosecution that the petitioners herein and others conducted Erudhu Virattu event in their Village, which is against the provisions under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act and the Tamil Nadu Jallikattu Regulation Act.

3. Considering the nature of allegations levelled against the petitioners, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruppathur, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a separate bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and

[a] the petitioners shall reside at Singampunari and sign before the S.V.Mangalam Police Station twice a day daily at 10:30 a.m., in the



morning and 06:30 p.m., in the evening for a period of two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation. [b] the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[c] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[d] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.
