PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

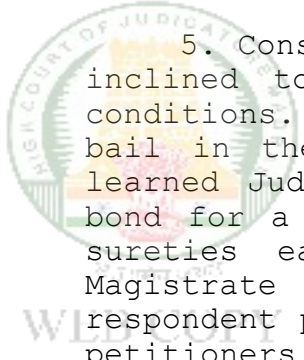
ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners, who are arrayed as accused Nos.1 to 6, apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 498(A), 406 I.P.C., r/w. Section 4 of Tamil Nadu Dowry Prohibition Act in Crime No.40 of 2015 on the file of the respondent police and hence, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The prosecution case is that the de-facto complainant married the first accused and thereafter, all the accused have joined together and harassed the de-facto complainant demanding additional dowry.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent and they have been falsely implicated in this case. It is further submitted that the first petitioner is the husband of the de-facto complainant and due to matrimonial dispute, a false complaint was given roping all the family members of the first petitioner in this case.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.side) submitted that the
<https://hcservices.courts.gov.in/hcservices> harassed the de-facto complainant demanding additional dowry.



5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of their arrest or on their appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Usilampatti and on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and the first petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.00 a.m. until further orders and the other petitioners shall appear before the respondent police as and when required. The petitioners shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

6. The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy is made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
