PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners, who are arrayed as accused, apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 294(b), 474, 427 and 506(i) of I.P.C. in Crime No.644 of 2015 on the file of the respondent police and hence, seek anticipatory bail.

2.According to the de-facto complainant that due to pathway dispute between the petitioners and the de-facto complainant, the accused have damaged the house of the de-facto complainant and other articles worth about Rs.50,000/-.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the first petitioner is the panchayat President and the second petitioner is the husband of A1 third petitioner is the friend of A2. It is further submitted that the petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case.

4.Heard the learned Government Advocate (Crl.side) appearing for the State.

5.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of their arrest or on their appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Padmanabhapuram and on each of them executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioners No.2 and 3 shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.00 a.m., until further order. The first petitioner shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation. The petitioners shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.



7. The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
