PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

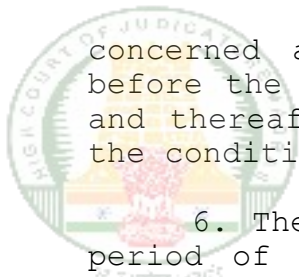
The petitioners, who are arrayed as accused, apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent Police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 294(b), 420 and 506(ii) IPC in Crime No.1081 of 2015 on the file of the respondent Police and hence, seek anticipatory bail.

2.According to the de facto complainant that on 24.09.2014, the accused have borrowed Rs.2,50,000/- from the de facto complainant by giving assurance to repay the amount with interest. But they did not repay the amount, thereby, cheated the de facto complainant.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and they have been falsely roped in this case. It is further submitted that the transaction between the de fact complainant is purely civil in nature and this compliant is filed to settle the dispute before the respondent Police.

4.Heard the learned Government Advocate (Crl.side) appearing for the respondent Police.

5.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Magistrate No.II, Madurai and on each of them executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate



concerned and on further condition that the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.00 am for a period of two weeks and thereafter as and when required. The petitioners shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

6. The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Court within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
