PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

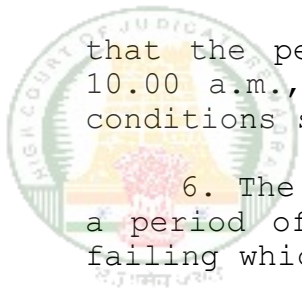
The petitioner, who is arrayed as accused No.2, in Crime No.220 of 2015 on the file of the respondent police, apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 341, 324 and 506(ii) of the Indian Penal Code and hence, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to civil dispute, the petitioner abused the defacto complainant with filthy language and criminally intimidated him.

3. The case of the petitioner is that the petitioner is an innocent person and due to civil dispute, the defacto complainant has given a false complaint against the petitioner. He has further submitted that the petitioner has given a complaint against the defacto complainant and therefore, this is a case and counter, case.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) submitted that this is a case and counter.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner, with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate at Perambalur and on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition



that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.00 a.m., until further orders. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

6. The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
