PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 498(A), 406 and 506(i) IPC in Crime No.1 of 2015 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the first accused - Ravi married the *de facto* complainant on 20.08.2010. It is alleged by the *de facto* complainant that the first accused - Ravi was having affair with another woman and the *de facto* complainant was subjected to cruelty. These petitioners are the relatives of the first accused - Ravi.

3. As the allegations against these petitioners are not very serious and relying upon the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Arnesh Kumar Vs.State of Bihar reported in 2014 (8) Scale 250, this Court is inclined to grant Anticipatory Bail to the petitioners herein.

4. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, No.I, Madurai, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- each (Rupees ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioners 1 and 2 shall report before the respondent police twice a day at 10:30 in the morning and 06:30 in the evening for a period of 15 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, thereafter as and when required for interrogation. The petitioners 3 and 4 shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation.



[b] the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[c] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[d] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Judicial Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].
