PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

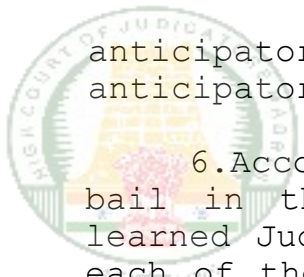
The petitioners, who are arrayed as A4 and A9 apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under sections 147, 148, 294(B), 324, 506(ii) IPC r/w 3 (1) of PDL Act, in Crime No.116 of 2015 on the file of the respondent police and hence, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that due to election motive in the Mosque, on 09.04.2015 when the de-facto complainant went to the hospital along with his brother in a two wheeler, the accused had intercepted in a car and abused the de-facto complainant with filthy language and attacked the de-facto complaint with Aruval and thereby caused injury.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and they have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that some of the co-accused were granted anticipatory bail by this court in Crl.O.P(MD)No.9304 of 2015, dated 21.05.2015.

4.Heard the learned Government Advocate (Criminal side) appearing for the respondent.

5.Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the fact that some of the co-accused were granted



anticipatory bail by this court, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Pattukottai, Thanjavur District and on each of them executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police daily at 05.30 p.m for a period of two weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation. The petitioners shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

7. The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
