Habeas Corpus Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying to issue a Writ of Habeas Corpus to call for the records relating to the detention order passed by the 2nd Respondent in P.D.O. No. 02/2015 dated 19/02/2015 under Tamil Nadu Acts 14/82 and quash the same and direct the Respondents to produce the body of the detenu Vijai @ Kadal Vijay @ Vijayakumar S/o. Selvam aged about 25 years before this Court and set him at liberty now detained at Central Prison, Tiruchirappalli.

ORDER

(Order of the Court was made by A. SELVAM, J.)

This Habeas Corpus Petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying to call for records relating to the detention order passed in P.D.O. No. 02/2015 dated 19/02/2015 by the detaining authority who has been arrayed as second respondent herein against the detenu by name Vijai @ Kadal Vijay @ Vijayakumar S/o. Selvam and quash the same and thereby set him at liberty forthwith.

2. The Inspector of Police, Pudukottai Town Police Station as sponsoring authority has submitted an affidavit to the detaining authority, wherein it is stated that the detenu has involved in the following adverse case.

registered under Sections 341, 147, 148, 294(b), 324 and
307 of the Indian Penal Code.



3. Further it is stated in the affidavit that on 23.01.2015, one Meenakshisundaram as defacto complainant has given a complaint in Town Police Station, Pudukottai against the detenu and the same has been registered in Crime No.42 of 2015 under Section 302 of the Indian Penal Code and ultimately requested the detaining authority to invoke Act 14 of 1982 against the detenu.

4. The detaining authority after considering the averments made in the affidavit and other connected documents has derived subjective satisfaction to the effect that the detenu is a 'habitual offender' and ultimately branded him as 'goonda' by way of passing the impugned detention order and in order to quash the same, the present Habeas Corpus Petition has been filed by the mother of the detenu as petitioner.

5. On the side of the respondents a detailed counter has been filed, wherein it has been contended to the effect that all the averments made in the petition are false and ultimately prayed to dismiss the same.

6. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner has contended that on the side of the detenu a representation has been submitted and the same has not been disposed of without delay and therefore, the detention order in question is liable to be quashed.

7. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor has contended that the representation submitted on the side of the detenu has been duly disposed of without delay and therefore, the detention order in question does not call for any interference.

8. On the side of the respondents, a proforma has been submitted, wherein it has been clearly stated that in respect of column Nos.7 to 9, 8 clear working days are available and in between column Nos.12 and 13, 3 clear working days are available and no explanation has been given on the side of the respondents with regard to such delay in disposing of the representation and that itself would affect the rights of the detenu guaranteed under Article 22(5) of the Constitution of India and therefore, the detention order in question is liable to be quashed.

9. In fine, this Habeas Corpus Petition is allowed and the detention order dated 19.02.2015 passed in P.D.O.No.02/2015 by the detaining authority/second respondent herein is quashed and the detenu by name Vijai @ Kadal Vijay @ Vijayakumar is ordered to be set at liberty forthwith, unless he is required to be incarcerated in any other case.
