Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying for issuance of a Writ of Mandamus, directing the 1st respondent to dispose the appeal petition dated 12.01.2015 preferred by the petitioner in pursuance of the rejection order passed by the 2nd respondent in his proceedings in Letter No.60473/CMPC/2014-1 dated 10.12.2014 and consequentially to direct the respondents to revise the scale of pay for the post of Secondary Grade Teacher as Rs.9300-34800+G.P.4200 on par with Central Government Teachers and on par with other ministerial service staff who are holding diploma certificate like Secondary Grade Teachers within the time that may be stipulated by this Court.

ORDER

Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and Mr.S.Kumar, learned Additional Government Pleader who takes notice on behalf of the respondents. By consent, the writ petition itself is taken up for final disposal at the admission stage.

2.The petitioner seeks for Mandamus directing the first respondent to dispose of the appeal petition dated 12.01.2015.

3.It is seen that the said appeal petition was filed challenging the order of the second respondent dated 10.12.2014. Having filed the appeal only on 12.01.2015, the petitioner has filed the present petition seeking for its disposal by not giving even sufficient time for the first respondent to consider and dispose of the same. I find that the present writ petition is highly premature and therefore, the writ petition is dismissed, however, with liberty to the petitioner to approach this Court, if the appeal filed by the petitioner is not disposed of within a reasonable time by the first respondent. No costs.
