THE COURT MADE THE FOLLOWING:

COMMON ORDER:

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These writ petitions are filed feeling aggrieved by seizure of the respective lorries of the petitioners on the allegation that they were used in the illegal sand transportation.

At the hearing, learned Government Pleader for Mines and Geology (TS) on instructions submitted that after the cases were adjourned, all the lorries were released on receipt of the prescribed penalties. Mr. K. Lakshmaiah, learned counsel,

representing Mr. V. Brahmaiah Chowdary, learned counsel for the petitioners in W.P. Nos.35064, 35127, 34970 and 34984 of 2015, Mrs. S. Annapurna, learned counsel for the petitioner in W.P.
