**WRIT PETITION No.25871 OF 2015**

**ORDER:**

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Government Pleader for Revenue appearing for the respondents.

With regard to pattadar passbooks and title deeds on the basis of the registered sale deeds executed in favour of the petitioners with regard to Ac.1.63 cents in Survey No.388/1, Ac.0.97 cents in Survey No.388/3 and Ac.0.66 cents in Survey No.451/4 of Mannepalli Village, Turakapalem Grama Panchayat, Tallur Mandal, Prakasam District, the petitioner stated to have made an application in Form VI-A of the Andhra Pradesh Rights in Land and Pattadar Passbooks Act, 1971 (for short, 'the Act') in June, 2014. On a count of inaction, he also stated to have made a representation to the Sub-Collector, Kandukur, Prakasam District, but alleging that no steps are being taken by the Tahsildar, Tallur Mandal, Prakasam District, the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent, the present Writ Petition is filed.

Since the petitioner seeks consideration of his application, as referred to above, under Form VI-A of the Act, it would be just and appropriate to direct the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent to consider the petitioner's application and pass appropriate orders within a period of four

weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

Subject to the above, the Writ Petition is disposed of. There shall be no order as to costs.

Miscellaneous petitions, if any, pending in this Writ Petition shall stand closed.
