ORDER :

This Criminal Petition is filed by the Petitioners/accused under Section 482 Cr.P.C seeking to quash the proceedings in Crime No. 29 of 2015 of Molakalacheruvu Police Station, Chittoor District registered for the offence punishable under Sections 498-A IPC and Sections 3 and 4 of Dowry Prohibition Act outcome of the report of 2nd respondent/ defacto complainant none other than the wife of A-1.

2) Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and the 1st respondent-State represented by the Public Prosecutor before admission, before ordering notice to the 2nd respondent and perused the material on record.

3) A perusal of the record, the material falls short to admit the application to quashing the F.I.R. but for to say from the factual matrix the petitioners are entitled to

concession of regular bail.

4) Accordingly, the Criminal Petition is disposed of giving liberty to the petitioners to surrender before the learned Magistrate and move regular bail with notice to the A.P.P concerned and the learned Magistrate, after hearing, shall grant bail on the same day with necessary conditions. The learned Magistrate can dispense with the presence of the accused at post bail stage pending investigation before the Court. Further remedies, if any, are left open in the event of filing charge sheet for any of the offences and any cognizance taken by the learned Magistrate. Consequently, the miscellaneous petitions, if any pending, shall stand closed.
