Counsel appearing for the respondent/contemners has filed in Court today a reply to the contempt petition and the same is taken on record. Complete copy has been furnished to the counsel for the petitioner.

Perusal of the reply would reveal that in compliance of the directions issued by the Division Bench dated 18.03.2014 in CWP No.15380 of 2013, the requisite pension payment order has been issued and in terms of which the petitioner has been held entitled to service pension from the date of completion of 15 years of qualifying service i.e. 26.11.2004. Copy of the pension payment order dated 18.11.2014 stands appended as Annexure R-1 along with reply.

Resultantly, the instant contempt petition is disposed of as

having been rendered infructuous.

Rule discharged.

It is, further observed that in pursuance to the pension payment order dated 18.11.2014, the Defence Pension Disbursing Office, Ludhiana would ensure the release of the requisite financial benefits in favour of the petitioner forthwith.
