MAHESH GROVER.J.

This is a petition under Section 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act. The petitioner alleges violation of the order of this court mandating consideration by the Senior Superintendent of Police (Rural), Amritsar into the grievance of the petitioner which she had expressed in her representation.

The complaint which the petitioner has made indicates a dispute within the family and probably arising out of a marital discord. The petitioner has already taken recourse to the remedies under the Domestic Violence Act. If this is so, then I am of the view that the respondent cannot be held liable for contempt merely because the petitioner was advised reconciliation when she went for redressal of her grievance to the Senior

Superintendent of Police. Vide order dated 27.5.2015 it was suggested to her that she should attempt resolution of conflict. Finding no violation of the orders of this court the petition is dismissed leaving the petitioner to other remedies in law.
