Learned State counsel has filed in Court today a response to the contempt petition by way of affidavit of the Executive Engineer, Central Works Division No.2, PWD (B&R) Branch, Amritsar and the same is taken on record. Copy has been furnished to learned counsel for the petitioner.

Perusal of the affidavit filed in Court today as also the receipt at Annexure R-1 appended along with, would reflect that a sum of Rs.33,83,377/- has been paid to the petitioner through the mode of E.C.S. Such receipt has been issued by the petitioner-company in token of having received full and final payment of the work done i.e. providing and laying marble flooring in the Parikarma of Holy Pond of Shri Ram Tirath Mandir
