Reply by way of an affidavit on behalf of the respondents is
taken on record.

Application stands disposed of.

COCP No.2349 of 2014

Counsel for the respondents points out that all the dues which
the petitioner was entitled to stands released to him. Counsel for the
petitioner states that he has no instructions in this regard.

In the light of the reply filed by the respondents especially para
2 thereof, it is apparent that the dues which the petitioner was entitled to
have been duly released to him. The contempt petition, therefore, has
become infructuous.

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In case, there are still some dues which the petitioner is entitled to as per the orders passed by this Court, he may submit a representation to respondent No.2-Executive Engineer Operation Division, UHBVNL, Jind, within a period of eight weeks from today. If such a representation is made, the same shall be considered and decided by respondent No.2 within a period of eight weeks from the date of submission of such representation. In case, the claim is accepted, the consequential benefits be released to the petitioner within a period of four weeks thereafter.

The contempt petition stands disposed of, accordingly.
