Compliance report dated 21.05.2015 by way of affidavit of Sh. Rajinder Singh, Deputy Inspector General of Police, Vigilance Bureau, Punjab, Chandigarh, has been filed in Court, taken on record, copy whereof has been handed over to the counsel for the petitioner.

Counsel for the respondent states that the vigilance enquiry stands concluded, according to which, no evidence has come during the enquiry which shows commission of a criminal offence nor has it come that any public funds have been siphoned off in the three companies, which have been referred to in the order dated 31.08.2013 passed by this Court. He

further states that the petitioner, if so desires, will be supplied the copy of the enquiry report if he applies under the Right to Information Act.

In view of the above, the present contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous with liberty to the petitioner to avail of his remedy in accordance with law.
