AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (Oral):

Reply by way of affidavit of Shri Gopal Krishan Singh, IAS, Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Ludhiana, on behalf of respondent No.1 as also reply by way of affidavit of Ms. Priyanka Bharti, Director-cum-Special Secretary, Government of Punjab, Department of Local Government-respondent No.1 filed in Court, taken on record, copies thereof have been supplied to the counsel for the petitioner.

Counsel for respondent No.2 states that the orders passed by this Court have been duly complied with as the benefits which the petitioner was entitled to, but has unfortunately died during the pendency of this petition, stand released to the widow of the petitioner.

In the light of the above, the present contempt petition is

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disposed of as infructuous with liberty to the legal representatives of the petitioner to make a representation to the Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Ludhiana-respondent No.2, in case, some other dues are still pending which are not released to the legal representatives of the petitioner.

If such a representation is made, the same shall be considered and decided by the Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Ludhiana-respondent No.2 within a period of six weeks from the date of submission of such representation. In case, the representation is accepted, the consequential benefits be released within a period of four weeks thereafter.
